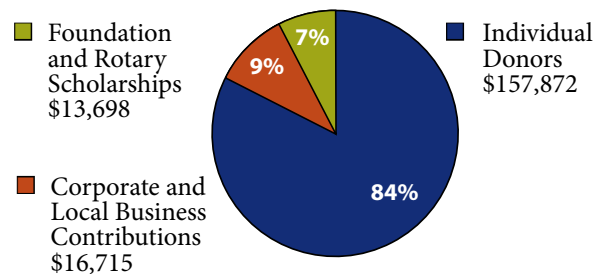

Hidden Gifts

As a little girl, scholarship recipient Lisa Wright *loved* school. In fact, she even used to ask her teachers for extra handouts just so she could play school at home. It was a welcome distraction from the poverty and abuse that characterized much of her childhood. She loved learning, and because she found that most subjects came easily to her, her dreams of college seemed like a real possibility despite her circumstances. When Lisa was 15, however, her mom pulled her out of school, claiming she would home school Lisa, and instead sent her to work full time at Dairy Queen to help pay the rent. So ended Lisa's dreams of college, or even finishing high school.

Over the years, Lisa married, had three daughters, and worked her way up from Dairy Queen to a position with Compaq Computers managing multimillion dollar accounts like Boeing. Lisa proved herself smart, resourceful, and determined to succeed, but a corporate merger led to her layoff when her job was outsourced to Costa Rica.

It was Fall 2009 and Lisa, now divorced, scrambled to find work that paid enough to support her daughters. Although she had gotten her GED, the employment market had turned brutal in the down economy and she simply couldn't find a job without a college degree, despite her impressive work history.

But there was a hidden gift in this challenging time because it led Lisa to Cascadia and the college education she always wanted. Lisa has overcome the financial obstacles that stood in her way thanks to vital financial assistance like Cascadia's Anderson Tuition Assistance Grant, generously funded by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. "I wouldn't be here right now without this scholarship. But I am here, and that's invaluable to me!"

Today Lisa is excited about learning, excited about her future, and excited to graduate with her associate degree in the spring. "I love Cascadia! It's really opening up my world and I'm so happy to be on this path!"
