

Flexibility in Attendance Accommodation Procedure

Description:

All students are required to complete the essential requirements of their courses, including attendance. However, students may have chronic or episodic medical conditions where course attendance may pose a barrier. Students who experience those barriers may have a Flexibility in Attendance accommodation. Student Accessibility Services (SAS) has created the agreement below to clarify the expectations of the student and the faculty to ensure there are reasonable modifications made to a course if a student cannot attend class due to a disability-related absence.

Building an Agreement:

- 1. If a student has <u>requested their accommodations</u> for the quarter and chose Flexibility in Attendance for a specific course, SAS staff will collaborate with their instructor to build an agreement for the course.
- 2. The following considerations must be accounted for when building this agreement:
 - This accommodation is not an automatic extension for assignments.
 - Faculty are not obligated to create extra work for either the student or themselves as a substitute for "participation" in class or missed assignments. However, faculty are encouraged to consider whether there are opportunities to make-up their absence.
 - The number of acceptable absences a student can miss before it would fundamentally alter the course outcomes will be determined. If the absences meet or exceed 50% of those stated in the Flexibility in Attendance Agreement, please notify SAS immediately.
- 3. After the number of acceptable absences has been determined by SAS staff and the faculty, SAS staff will meet with the student review the agreements, answer any questions, and address any concerns.

Considerations

Below are the questions used to determine if a Flexibility in Attendance Agreement is appropriate and how many acceptable absences can be allowed in a course. Other considerations include the student's situation but are not limited to:

- 1. What guidelines are given in the course syllabus regarding attendance?
- 2. Is attendance factored into the final grade? If yes, what is the percentage?
- 3. Is there regular classroom interaction between the faculty and students and among the students themselves?
- 4. Does the fundamental nature of the course rely upon student participation as an essential method of learning?
- 5. Do student contributions in class constitute a significant component of the learning process?
- 6. To what degree does a student's failure to attend class constitute a significant loss of the educational experience of other students in the class?
- 7. Is there an alternative method for the student to make up class participation?
