 - Writing tutor: minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA in writing coursework
 - o Public speaking tutor: minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Minimum course completion:
 - Math/STEM tutor: completion of at least *one* of the following with a 3.0 or better: MATH 107, 141, 146, or 147
 - Writing tutor: ENGL 101 or equivalent
 - Public speaking tutor: ENGL 095 or equivalent and CMST&220 with a 3.0 or better

Preferred Qualifications:

- Completion of additional coursework in the intended tutoring area provides applicants with valuable experience that can inform their work as a peer tutor. Our preference is for applicants who have completed one or more of the following courses:
