Art Show and Live Performance Coming to Cascadia Community College

(Bothell, WA) – A fossil whale bone, a 19th century grinding stone, an alibi. These are among the dozens of surprising and curious objects found by faculty, staff, students and friends of Cascadia Community College, and assembled for an exhibit called

“This is a way of creating community through an art show,” says Jared Leising, one of the Cascadia faculty members responsible for curating the show. “A lot of people participated by sharing objects and their stories of finding them. The items themselves offer us glimpses -- whether strange, heartbreaking, or hilarious -- into other people’s lives.”

The art show is kicking off its opening week with a visit by Davy and Peter Rothbart, creators of Found Magazine. As part of a national tour celebrating the magazine’s 10th anniversary, the Rothbart brothers will perform a live show: one part storytelling, one part show-and-tell. The *Los Angeles Times* calls Davy and Peter “utterly engaging performers.”
