HOLI

Holi, which is known as the Festival of Color is a traditional Hindu holiday that celebrates the coming of Spring. It is also known as the Festival of Love with one of its main themes always being unity. Holi is known for its colors and celebrated on the last full moon of the lunar month. While there are many stories associated with Holi, the origin of love comes from the story of how Krishna (who loved playing pranks) fell in love with Radha, a milkmaid. Krishna was afraid that Radha would not like him because his skin was unintentionally turned blue as a child from an assassination attempt! During a game, he playfully painted her face with different colors, creating the origin of the colored powder and water that is tossed around during the Holi celebration. While Holi is celebrated throughout the world, it is the most popular in India and Nepal. (Gonzalez, 2017)



Unlike the U.S. when Mother's Day is celebrated in May, in the Middle East it is celebrated in March. Originally the special day was introduced in Egypt in 1956 by journalist Mustafa Amin who campaigned for the celebration of mothers for over a year. The first day of Spring was chosen because of its representation of new life. Teachers and elders at work are also celebrated this day to show appreciation for their hard work and contributions to raising the next generation. NOWRUZ

From Dr. Kimia Ghanbeigi, Physics Professor: Nowruz, also known as the Persian New Year, is a joyous and vibrant celebration that marks the beginning of the spring season and the first day of the Iranian calendar. The word "Nowruz" means "new day" in Persian. It is celebrated by millions of people around the world, particularly in Iran, and many other countries across Central Asia, the Caucasus, and the Middle East. Persian New Year celebration, which is based on solar calendar, starts at the exact moment of the vernal equinox on March 20th or 21st, this creating a sense of unity for people no matter where they live since it is celebrated to the same second in time around the globe. During Nowruz, families and friends come together to celebrate with traditional foods, music, and customs such as setting up a display of flowers, spring plants, wearing new cloths, painting eggs, and setting up a haft-seen table with seven symbolic items starting with the letter "S." Nowruz is a time of renewal, hope, and joy, symbolizing the arrival of spring and the rejuvenation of nature. It is a time for people to come together, celebrate their culture and heritage, and look forward to the year ahead.
