

Underage Admission Exception Procedure

General Admissions Eligibility

Adult members of the community 18 years or older, or those with a high school diploma or GED, are eligible to enroll in courses at Cascadia College.

Underage Admissions Exception

Cascadia College does not wish to duplicate or replace the functions of local high schools. However, high school students may request special admission to take specific courses at the college on a quarterly basis. Underage students (9th -12th grade level status) who are not Running Start students may enroll under exceptional circumstances. Students seeking enrollment as an underage student on a long term basis should explore admissions through our <u>Running Start Program</u>.

NOTE: If you are a **Running Start Student trying to enroll for summer class**, contact the Running Start Office and notify that you are enrolled as a Running Start student who would like to enroll for the summer. You do not have to complete Underage Admissions. The summer tuition is on your own and due by the tuition deadline. If you register after the tuition deadline, tuition is due within one business day of registration.

To qualify for an exception to Cascadia's general admission requirements as an underage student, the following steps must be completed:

- 1. Complete Cascadia's application for admission.
- 2. Determine placement. Students must demonstrate academic preparedness for college-level by placing into English 101 College Composition based on one of the following methods.
 - Accuplacer
 - Smarter Balanced score 3 or 4 on English Language Assessment from Sophmore year
 - SAT score of 480 on Evidence-Based Reading and Writing
 - ACT score of 19 on both Reading and Writing
 - Second semester grade of B or higher in Junior year English course

- 3. Read through the Underage Admissions Packet and submit the required the following documents.
 - School District Enrollment Release Form
 - Parent/Student Release Form
 - Most recent Official High School Transcript (redact your student number)
 - A written statement from the school principal or counselor documenting why enrollment in the specific college course is necessary
 - Copy of qualifying score showing placement into English 101/College Composition
- 4. Email the required Underage Admissions documents (listed in step#3) to Vickie Ashe at vashe@cascadia.edu.
- 5. If approved for Underage Admissions, you will need to sign up and attend CORE (Cascadia's Orientation and Registration Experience). At the CORE session, you will:
 - Receive an introduction to Cascadia's programs, services, and degree option
 - Learn about resources available for academic and personal success as a student at Cascadia
 - Get help from an Academic Advisor interpreting your placement scores and choosing courses that promote your academic success
 - Learn how to search, select, register, add, drop, or withdraw from classes for the upcoming quarter
 - Register for classes in the upcoming quarter
- 6. Pay tuition by the tuition deadline.



- 7. Get your computer and email account information. Visit the <u>Student Accounts</u> webpage for information about setting up your network and email account.
- 8. Buy your books online at www.ubookstore.com or on campus at the University Bookstore.
- 9. Attend classes.

Students will be expected to adhere to Cascadia's Academic Standards and Progress.

Students who plan to apply credits earned at Cascadia towards completion of a high school diploma from their current high school are responsible for consulting their high school counselor to ensure that college classes meet high school graduation requirements. College officials are not responsible for advising students as to whether or not a college class will meet high school graduation requirements.

4.	Students are responsible for arranging their college schedule so it does not conflict with their high school schedule. College courses are offered in four 11-week quarters beginning in September (fall), January (winter), March/April (spring) and July (summer).			
5.	Students are responsible for the following: a. Tuition costs, books, supplies and fees b. Appropriate behavior as outlined in the Student Handbook c. Registration Information and Documentation d. Attendance, homework and communication with instructors e. Transportation f. Sending copies of official transcripts to their high school g. Registering each quarter with an advisor
