#### Minimum Qualifications:

- Student must be taking at least 6 credits at Cascadia College or the University of Washington for the quarter they will serve as GSS Leader
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 for all college coursework
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 in GSS discipline coursework
- Completion of GSS course with a 3.0 or above

#### **Preferred Qualifications:**

- Prior tutoring and/or teaching experience
- Prior leadership experience
- · Prior enrollment with the instructor who will teach the GSS course

#### Knowledge, Qualities, and Skills:

- Excellent understanding of concepts, theory, and practice in GSS subject matter
- Excellent interpersonal skills and ability to communicate effectively and positively with students, instructors, and other college staff
- · Ability to work independently and as a member of the GSS team
- Ability to exercise sound judgment
- Ability to work effectively with a diverse student population

#### **Primary Duties:**

- Successfully complete mandatory GSS leader orientation and training
- Attend all class meetings for the selected course, take notes, review homework and assigned reading materials
- Conduct three separate one-hour study sessions per week utilizing the collaborative learning techniques and study group activities practiced during training
- Create session plans for each study session
- Create handouts or any other documents that will be used in the study sessions
- Ascertain course requirements and maintain contact throughout the term with course instructor
- Regularly meet with supervisor(s) and/or Senior GSS leaders for debrief sessions to discuss:
  - Observations of the study sessions
  - Creation and use of study session handouts
  - The planning of sessions and use of a wide variety of learning strategies

- Any problems or potential problems with sessions or GSS leader roles and responsibilities
- Make periodic announcements about the content and availability of the study sessions to students
- Attend staff meetings
- Complete all required paperwork (attendance records, session plans, timesheets, etc.)
- Submit all required paperwork to supervisor in a timely manner
- Maintain a professional attitude about matters such as class standards, grades, and student complaints
- Model appropriate professional attitudes and behaviors to staff, students, and others
- · Maintain regular working hours
- Other duties as assigned by the supervisor
